The Science Based Targets (SBTi) initiative is looking for an experienced **Technical Integration (Senior) Manager** in its Impact Department to manage technical deliverables behind priority and strategic technical partnerships, ensure the highest standards of technical support for partners and other stakeholders and embed SBTi products within the corporate climate action ecosystem.

This position will report to: the Technical Partnership Lead based in The Netherlands. The role will require close coordination with the SBTi Technical Department.

This role plays an important part in achieving: the technical implementation of the SBTi's strategy to mainstream the adoption of science-based targets and maximize its climate impact through strategic technical partnerships to embed SBTs and the SBTi in the wider climate action ecosystem.

About the SBTi:

The Science Based Targets Initiative (SBTi) is a global body enabling businesses to set ambitious emissions reductions targets in line with the latest climate science. It is focused on accelerating companies worldwide to halve emissions before 2030 and achieve net-zero emissions before 2050.

The SBTi defines and promotes best practices in science-based target setting, offers resources and guidance to reduce barriers to adoption, and independently assesses and approves companies' targets.

About the Impact Department:

The SBTi Impact Department plays a crucial role in engaging stakeholders across the corporate, financial, and NGO sectors to promote the work of SBTi and support the development and refinement of the SBTi's standards, with the goal of advancing ambitious corporate climate action to achieve emissions reductions at scale.

The department has one of the broadest remits among those within the SBTi, as it is responsible for delivering SBTi's organizational strategy, fundraising and cultivating donor relationships as the SBTi expands, facilitating stakeholder engagement groups and



public consultations as part of the standards development process, soliciting feedback from the market on standards' relevance and implementability, strengthening partnerships to address systemic barriers to decarbonization, and integrating SBTi's standards within the broader climate action ecosystem to drive collaboration and harmonization.

Key responsibilities include:

- Drive implementation and integration of technical partnerships
 - Program management of all SBTi's external consultations with other standards, including liaising with technical team to gather input across the organization.
 - Responsible for technical integration and alignment of SBTi with other frameworks, including conducting gap analysis and assessing where integration and alignment is needed, to propose potential content changes, in alignment with the Technical teams.
 - Manage action plans that enhance SBTi's influence in the development and revision of external standards.
 - Contribute/Lead the development of internal knowledge resources on global standards, benchmarks, and regulatory requirements.
 - Insight gathering on priority initiatives focused on climate reporting, disclosures standards and frameworks, to support partnerships.
- Embedding SBTi into the financial and corporate climate action ecosystem
 - Supports/Leads in managing partnerships with partners that play an important role in the climate standards ecosystem, including global standards, benchmarking alliances, and rating agencies.
 - Leads the integration of SBTi as appropriate with climate disclosure platforms, ratings agencies, standards setters, and voluntary initiatives in order to raise ambition or provide companies with an 'on-ramp' towards adopting SBTi standards.
 - Aligns with the Communications teams to create clear narratives on current technical integration and interoperability
 - Contributes to the development of departmental plans and other organizational priorities, as needed.

Essential skills and experience needed

- Excellent technical knowledge of relevant GHG emissions, disclosure methodologies, climate standards, initiatives and organizations in the climate action ecosystem.
- Excellent project management from initiation to delivery;
- Excellent writing skills, including the ability to make complex technical subjects accessible to non-expert audiences;
- Proven experience in cross-departmental collaboration, development of partnerships, stakeholder management on technical climate topics, strategy



development

- Good public speaking skills and proven ability to interact with different level representatives, from private, nonprofit and public sectors, with confidence and fluency on key issues;
- Ideally hybrid experience in both the private sector and the nonprofit sector with mission driven organizations;
- A relationship-oriented approach, with strong emotional intelligence, empathy, humility, and an outstanding ability to build and maintain relationships with partners, funders, sponsors, and members;
- Ability to take initiative, multi-task, prioritize and give strong attention to detail;
- Ability to work collaboratively with a range of teams and external stakeholders, liaising as needed across different time zones and cultures;
- Ability to work in a fast-paced environment;
- Ability to work flexible hours due to the international nature of the work;
- Excellent English communication skills (verbal and written).

This is a full-time role based in the Netherlands. The salary will depend on the level of knowledge and experience. This role is a fixed-term contract for 12 months with the possibility of extension.

Interested candidates should be legally allowed to work in the Netherlands. The SBTi cannot sponsor any working visas.
